SCHOOL EXPERIENCE

Nacel provides European Union students with a choice of public school placements in Dublin area. All schools require uniforms and many schools were founded by religious orders, but welcome students of all faiths.

A typical school day begins at 9am and ends around 3.45pm. There are eight classes per day with one short break. Extracurricular activities vary from school to school but usually sports activities are provided. Students may also join local clubs for sports and activities e.g Football, Basketball, Judo, Dance and Music.

Students are hosted by local families, warm and welcoming.

SCHOOL SYSTEM

There are three distinct levels of education in Ireland: primary, secondary and higher education. Most students attend and complete secondary education. Secondary education is generally completed at a community school, a comprehensive school a vocational school or a voluntary secondary school. A typical secondary school will consist of 1st to 3rd year, the optional Transition Year (age under 16), the 5th year (age 16/17) and 6th year (age 17 and over).

Courses offered generally include Art, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Physics, English, Economics, French, German, Geography, History, Home Economics, Mathematics, Music, Religion, Computer and P.E.. Some schools offer extra English classes.

The Transition Year is usually very popular among international students. It is a one-year informal course taken by an increasing number of students. It represents a good opportunity for international students to take less academic subjects, receive work experience, try new subjects and develop their English skills while interacting with their classmates.

The school year runs from late August/early September to late May.

Graduation is possible.

Requirements: Students must be interviewed in their home country before being accepted. A minimum of two years of English study and good academic results are required.
